CONTENT

A cat or a dog, a hamster or a guinea pig? Or maybe an aquarium with all kinds of fish? Lots of children want to have their own animal. This book speaks to this desire, and shows which animals make good pets, where you can get them, how much space and what else they need, as well as how to take care of them. The topics are not addressed in the tone of a guidebook. Instead, through many everyday situations children become familiar with the characteristics and needs of animals - and what you can do and experience with them. Readers take a trip to a puppy obedience school



and to a veterinarian to see how birds and rabbits become tame. Questions such as "Can a dog talk?" and "Does a cat have to wash itself?" are thoroughly answered. At the same time, children learn that having a pet means accepting responsibility for the animal and making sure it is treated well. Cats, dogs, birds, guinea pigs, hamsters and rabbits populate the book; we even have a look into an aquarium. And finally, a few of the more exotic house pets are introduced.

THE ILLUSTRATOR

Kyrima Trapp lives in a small house near Münster. Since she was a child, Kyrima has known that she wanted to paint. To follow that dream, she studied graphic arts and design in Münster and has focused on illustrating children's books. She now works as a freelance illustrator for several publishers and paints according to the motto: "I want children to enjoy books."
