ABOUT THE SERIES

The treacherous god Loki has played a trick that catapults Viggo from the present into the rugged world of the Vikings. Ragnarök, the legendary end of the world, is unfolding there. Loki has his own sinister plans, and Viggo plays a key role both in Loki's plot and in preventing Ragnarök.

CONTENT

In The Dragon's Ring, Viggo, the son of a mythical valkyrie, understands he is the only one who can alter the course of Ragnarök, the legendary end of the world. He will need Loki's help, but Loki has been banned to an island swathed in mist. The chains that bind him were forged by Thor himself and can only be released by the magical dwarf ring Draupnir. To obtain the ring Viggo must first possess the divine Gjallarhorn and travel through an icy intermediary world to drink of the spring of the gods and temporarily acquire their wisdom. His journey is made more challenging by encounters with a monstrous wolf and the dragon Fafnir. Viggo has encountered Fafnir before, and when he arrives at the spring he learns that Fafnir has Draupnir. With great dexterity Viggo makes a deal with Fafnir and takes the ring. When he frees Loki, however, Loki disappears taking with him not only Draupnir, but also Viggo's divine spear Gungnir and the Gjallarhorn. That means Loki has three of the six artifacts of power he needs to bend Ragnorök to his favor...

Richard Dübell, born in 1962, writes historical novels for teens and adults as well as film scripts, and has been celebrated for his cultural achievements by his hometown, Landshut, Germany. Dübell's novels have been translated into fourteen languages worldwide.
